SUBJECT: - RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST:

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION (0600PST):

All the major rivers are flowing below low flood level.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:

- Yesterday's well marked low over Northeast Arabian Sea has intensified into Cyclonic Storm (Hikka) and today lies over Northeast Arabian Sea & adjoining East central Arabian Sea (Lat: 20.5° & Long:66.2°), 430 km South-Southwest of Karachi, it is likely to move Westwards & hit Oman coast.
- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Northern parts of Iran moved Eastwards and today lies over Northeastern parts of Iran.
- Seasonal low lies over Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Bay of Bengal are penetrating upper parts of the country upto 4000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Mainly dry weather is expected over most parts of the country. However, isolated thunderstorm/ rain is expected over the upper catchments of all the major rivers (except upper Indus) along with Malakand, Hazara, Bannu, Kohat, Peshawar, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Lahore & Faisalabad Divisions and Southeast Sindh.

IV: MAJOR RIVERS CATCHMENTS' RAINFALL RECORDED (IN MM) LAST 24 HRS (UPTO 0800 PST):

Indus: Mithi=02, Islamabad (Saidpur=01 & Zeropoint=Trace), Mohmand Dam =Trace.

Chenab: Barnala=18.

V: WEATHER/FLOOD OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HRS:

No Change.
